Once again, the folks at Crabtree Valley Baptist Church have stepped up when needed. Back at the end of May, I checked in with my orthopedist about some numbness I was having in my right hand. Previously he determined that I was experiencing Carpal Tunnel Syndrome problems in both hands. Of course, I don't notice it much in my left hand. I'm ridiculously right-handed. Instead of the new routine of exercises or therapy I expected, he advised doing surgery. Without thinking about it I scheduled it for the next week. He said that I would be moving my fingers and working on range of motion almost immediately so I figured I'd only need a week or so break from typing. I was wrong. This week is the first time I've been able to type with all 10 fingers. Thankfully a few folks at our church were willing to submit articles for the time I've been out of commission. I know you've enjoyed reading the articles from Bonnie Wright and Ernie Rushing as well as the monthly submission from Pastor Nola. I deeply appreciate their help and hope that anyone who would like to submit something would feel free to do so. Thank you, thank you, CVBC family. You're the best!

Speaking of family, I have always enjoyed the weeks following the return of our youth from their summer camp. It's wonderful to see the enthusiasm and pure love they show for each other and for the Lord. They are connected to each other even more strongly than before they left and their shared experiences serve to build a firm foundation for their growing faith. They have fun, of course, and spend lots of time getting to know each other and meeting the youth from other churches. But it's so much more than that. I believe that an important goal of these camps is to provide the opportunity to focus on the Lord. We are never without the love of Jesus but most of the time life's necessities get in the way of us enjoying time with Him. But for this week, these young people can pause to think about where they fit according to God's plan. They talk to adults, youth leaders and staff about how to manage to live in this world and still be true to God's will. Our lives don't offer many opportunities to retreat from the world and experience uninterrupted time with the Lord. It seems that often we really have to fight for time to stop and study God's word. There are few opportunities for us to just sit quietly and contemplate. And when was the last time you screamed and sang and clapped in sheer devotion during a worship service? I agree, that would seem uncomfortable for most of us. It isn't for our young people, though. That's what they would do at a concert featuring a favorite rock band, right?

When my kids would climb into the car after a busy week at camp, I knew what to expect. They were exhausted, hoarse and grouchy from lack of sleep. I knew I had piles of laundry to wash. Occasionally there was a damp sleeping bag to hang out or muddy clothes to clean. But I knew they had just had a special experience – one that would stick with them in the long run. I knew that they had returned from a place where they could formulate the basis for their faith without judgment. I knew that their heads were full of new ideas and goals. In spite of the fact that I never actually attended camp with them, I benefitted from their experiences there. My kids are grown now but I know they still remember the fun they had and the knowledge they gained while at camp. Thanks, CVBC family for supporting them.
