Last week John and I went to Jamaica. When we arrived, the driver advised us that the commute from the airport to our resort would take about 90 minutes, including a short stop to stretch our legs. As we traveled the rugged, narrow, winding roads, I soon realized why we needed to break up the drive. I, for one, was ready to relax my hand muscles which had held a constant grip on the bar in front of my seat.

We finally arrived at the resort safely and had a wonderful week. On the morning of our departure, we had just left the premises when we saw some commotion on the road in front of us. A big tree branch was blocking the road – the only main road that led back to the airport. This branch had nothing to do with a thunder storm. It had been cut down on purpose as a public protest. The local people wanted their government to fix the poor road conditions. I can see why. I can't blame them for desiring safe roads for traveling to work and school. But John and I had to catch a flight!

After pondering the situation, our bus driver announced he would to take us the "back way" – "through the mountain road" – "it will only add about an hour to our travel time"! Needless to say, we were feeling quite anxious about all of this.

It was a daunting ride back to the airport. We were, however, able to calm down enough to enjoy some breath-taking views. I thought about how we would have missed out on these views if our plans had not been interrupted. We would have missed seeing the school children all dressed up in their uniforms walking to school, the numerous churches along the way (including some Baptist ones!), and on getting a glimpse at the way of life for the local Jamaicans. This detour in our plan ended up being a huge blessing. We were reminded that for these beautiful natives, traveling on awful roads was something they dealt with every day. We only experienced a one-time inconvenience. While our kids have always been able to ride a bus to school, most of the children there had to walk long distances on narrow, dangerous roads. I cannot even image the worry I would have every day about sending my kids to school that way.

We were blessed by this interruption to our plans. Do you ever find that the interruptions in your life end up being a blessing? Do they ever cause you to see a bigger picture and to think less about yourself and more about someone else? *"The Lord... makes the plans of the people of no effect. The counsel of the Lord stands forever."* (Psalm 33:10-11) I hope God will bless your next "interruption."
