

Each month, I strive to have us focus on a “value” that connects with something taking place during that month. For example, in October we focused on “Welcoming and Celebrating Our Differences” because that tied in well with World Communion Sunday. In December, we will emphasize “Music Ministry” because we tend to get enthusiastic about music when we sing Advent songs and Christmas carols.

So what “value” will we focus on during the month of November? Generosity through gifts and service. What’s the connection?

Thanksgiving and giving thanks.

We have so many things to be thankful for that we cannot limit our thankfulness to just one day. Every day is an opportunity to give thanks. We are thankful for friends, family, church, health, freedom, and so much more. We are thankful for the beauty of God’s creation, and for the many ways that God provides for us. God is faithful and never forsakes us. God is also *giving!* He is a *generous* God!

When we are generous, we become what God wants us to be. Generosity focuses on the spiritual qualities of the giver, derived from the generosity of God, rather than on the church’s need for money. While the church does need your contributions in order to function, it is ultimately more important to think about your need to express your thankfulness to God. We can show God thankfulness in our daily prayers. We can show God thankfulness through our weekly worship. We can show our thankfulness through obedient living. And we can show our thankfulness to God in our generosity through gifts and service. When we are generous, we are not only giving thanks, but we are also imitating God’s generosity. Generosity is a fruit of the spirit, a sign of our spiritual growth. Generosity through gifts and service is certainly something to be valued.

“The most generous God who gives seed to the farmer that becomes bread for your meals is more than extravagant with you. He gives you something you can then give away, which grows into full-formed lives, robust in God, wealthy in every way, so that you can be generous in every way...” – 2 Corinthians 9:11, The Message
