I have been enjoying the miniseries "The Roosevelts" this week on television. There was so much I didn't know about Theodore, Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt. The series went into detail about each person, showing where they came from and what part they played in our history. I started out with limited knowledge: Teddy Roosevelt was a Rough Rider; Franklin was the President in office during the attack on Pearl Harbor and Eleanor was his wife. There was so much more to know about these famous people.

For example, Teddy Roosevelt struggled with asthma as a child. He was sickly and no one expected him to amount to anything special. Instead of allowing the disease dictate his future, he faced it head on. He challenged himself at every opportunity. He exercised and toughened himself until people marveled at his energy and physical ability. In the case of FDR, he wasn't well liked for most of his early life. People thought him snobbish and arrogant because of his family's affluence. They couldn't imagine that he and Teddy Roosevelt were related at all – Teddy so rough around the edges and FDR almost aristocratic in his attitude. Eleanor's own mother was disappointed in her daughter's plainness and really never developed much of a bond with her. Each one of these American leaders had to overcome obstacles throughout their lives. And each had a special place in their hearts for people who were struggling to survive here in this "land of plenty".

One statement stood out to me regarding this account of our history. In essence, it was that somehow people appear on the scene when our country really needs a special person. I think it is fair to say that each of these figures played an important part in leading our nation through difficult times. Each started or facilitated programs that still exist today – the National Park System, the Peace Corps, the United Nations and many more. I don't think that's an accident, either. I believe that God puts people where He needs them to be. He equips them with the skills needed for the task. He gives them the courage to face awesome tasks. No, they weren't perfect individuals. But their overall impact was positive. God doesn't need us to start out perfect. If we let Him, He will equip us to accomplish the tasks that are needed, big or small. Most of us won't achieve the things the Roosevelt's were able to achieve, but we should be able to make positive changes in our lives – with His help.
