If you are looking for a place to visit, let me suggest that you plan a trip to The Sight and Sound Theatre just outside Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Billed as "the largest faith-based live theatre in the country", this theatre and its sister in Branson, MO were visited by nearly a million people from around the world last year.

We have just returned from seeing "Samson" at the 2000 seat theatre that is filled to capacity twice each day. The production was outstanding, inspirational, well done with remarkable talent and almost unbelievable special effects (Samson's destruction of the temple at the end of the drama will leave you spell bound). But even more impressive is the emphasis that all of their productions (We have now seen 4 of them) give to Jesus Christ and the salvation that he offers.

These productions are more than entertainment; they are intentional efforts to call people to Jesus Christ by making the Bible come alive. At the end of the drama, an invitation to receive Christ is offered with counselors available to assist anyone who is interested in receiving Christ as their Lord and Savior.

In a day when good, clean, wholesome entertainment is scarce, it is encouraging to see people from around the world flocking to hear the gospel message through Christian drama.

Over the years, the Sight and Sound Theatres have presented the Biblical stories of Noah, Abraham, Daniel, Joseph, Jonah and Moses and more. By popular demand, Jonah will be the featured Biblical drama returning for 2017.

This is to notify all church members of a change in Article VIII (Item 4) of our Church Constitution that will be voted on at the October 23<sup>rd</sup> business meeting and again at the next scheduled business meeting. This change is to reflect our policy regarding the elimination of the need to re-baptize by immersion new members who were previously baptized in a non-Baptist church by another method of baptism. The change in policy has already been incorporated into the Constitution by two previous votes earlier this year. The two upcoming votes will specifically address this new policy as it pertains to ‘watch care’ members, a point that was overlooked during the first voting process on this issue. Please plan to attend these business meetings so that you can cast your vote on this change.
