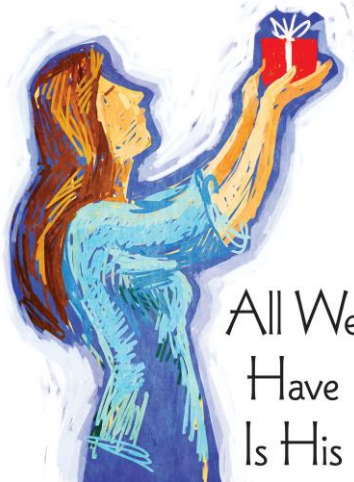

## THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

We are in the final week of February and already asking "Where has the time gone?" In the business world January and February are inventory months. It is important for those in the business world to know if they had a profit or loss and how much. I never cease to be amazed at how many stores go out of business around this time of year. Financially, they have failed. They were unable to live up to their expectations, unable to pay their bills, unable to make the changes necessary to survive in a highly competitive marketplace.

This is also the time of year that thoughts turn to income tax. You might ask, "do you have to bring that up?" No one enjoys paying income tax or even reporting it but we all know the consequences of ignoring the law.

Whether we are talking about inventory or taxes, in essence we are talking about accountability. Our National and State laws require individual accountability.
