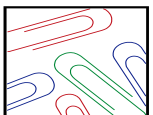

GUEST PREACHER

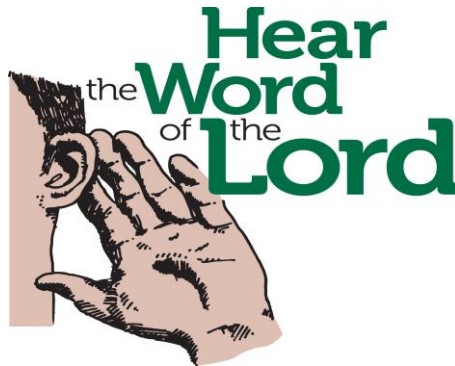
